## Who we are

The American Public Health Association® is the oldest and most diverse organization of public health professionals in the world and has been working to improve public health since 1872. The Association aims to protect all Americans and their communities from preventable, serious health threats and strives to assure community-based health promotion and disease prevention activities and preventive health services are universally accessible in the United States. APHA® is committed to health equity and a healthy global society. APHA believes health is a fundamental human right and works to ensure that everyone who cares about the health of their community has a voice in the national public health debate.

## What we do

APHA builds a collective voice to advocate for public health, working to ensure access to care, protect funding for core public health services and eliminate health disparities, among a myriad of other issues. Through its two flagship publications—the peer-reviewed *American Journal of Public Health*® and the award-winning newspaper *The Nation's Health*—reports, e-newsletters and social media, the Association communicates the latest public health science and practice with members, opinion leaders and the public.

The Association's Annual Meeting brings together thousands of public health professionals, agencies and partners to network and share the latest public health data and trends, as well as set policy on emerging public health concerns. The Association helps advance the profession by providing continuing education and opportunities for collaboration and cooperation across sectors and disciplines. APHA publishes science- and advocacy-based books, provides information to the news media and policy-makers needing background or direct testimony, and advocates for legislative, legal, policy, corporate and regulatory changes that protect the public's health. The Association's members—a broad array of public health professionals—advocate for healthy people and communities, and serve as advisors to boards and committees at the national, state and local levels. Fifty-three state and regional public health associations are affiliated with APHA.

## What is public health?

Public health is the practice of preventing premature disease, disability and death, and promoting health within groups of people, from small communities to entire countries. By focusing on prevention, public health professionals educate people about the effects behavior, lifestyle choices and social conditions have on their health to help prevent the onset of disease and improve health outcomes. Similarly, public health professionals use population health surveillance and policy development to understand the prevalence of disease in a population and, in turn, create policies that protect and promote health.

Public health as a profession encompasses people from many fields who share the common purpose of protecting the health of a population; APHA represents many of those professionals. With its focus on preventing disease, disability and death, public health reduces human suffering, improves quality of life and saves resources over the long term.

# Reforming our nation's health system, improving public health

**I**N A YEAR WHEN FEDERAL HEALTH reform moved forward and a tight economy put continued pressure on the nation, APHA succeeded on many fronts in protecting and promoting public health while strengthening the Association and positioning it for the future.

Chief among its priorities, APHA seized opportunities to advance implementation of the new health reform law through its strong advocacy, policy and communications work, and by convening and preparing public health professionals and partners for the changes ahead. Two forums—APHA's Summit on Health Reform in Denver in November and APHA's first-ever Midyear Meeting in Chicago in June—drew more than 1,000 attendees to learn more about their roles in realizing the goals of the historic law and how to ensure the law results in both greater access to quality care as well as better health and well-being.

The daylong summit culminated with the release of “Reforming our Nation’s Health System: Lessons for the Public Health Community,” a report that underscores the importance of keeping public health and prevention central to the implementation of the Affordable Care Act if health reform is to succeed. The report urged public health professionals to advocate and educate on behalf of the law, demonstrate the value of public health and prevention programs, seize funding opportunities and ensure that public health has a voice in reforms.

This year, APHA’s Center for Public Health Policy released two pivotal issue briefs highlighting the opportunities presented by health reform for the field of public health. “Prevention Provisions in the Affordable Care Act” summarizes the elements of the law designed to improve access to preventive services and activities, support the public health infrastructure and improve health outcomes through prevention. “The Affordable Care Act’s Public Health Workforce Provisions: Opportunities and Challenges,” released in concert with APHA’s Midyear Meeting, highlighted the fact that even as the federal health reform law puts an important focus on disease prevention and health promotion, the law does not adequately invest in the public health workforce. Both briefs reflect APHA’s concerted effort to educate public health practitioners and policy-makers about the provisions of the law that have the greatest impact on the public health system and the new opportunities it presents.

As U.S. courts addressed the legal challenges brought against the measure, APHA stepped up to speak out in support of the law and joined a friend-of-the-court brief to support the Affordable Care Act’s provisions.

The sweeping new health reform law delivered major changes that impact the future of public health practice, including expanded access to care and historic investments in prevention with the establishment of the Prevention and Public Health Fund.



# Advocating for and building a stronger public health system

**I**N ADDITION TO HEALTH REFORM, APHA succeeded in helping deliver other major health accomplishments this year. The White House released the nation's first-ever comprehensive AIDS strategy, an evidence-based plan to address the HIV/AIDS epidemic. President Barack Obama signed a food safety law to reduce the dangerous gaps in the country's woefully outdated food safety system. And Congress passed and the president approved the reauthorization of child nutrition programs that improve school meals and physical activity and wellness initiatives among our nation's kids.

Protecting funding for public health programs and services once again was a key issue for APHA and will be an ongoing advocacy priority. Outreach on the part of the Association's members stressed the need not to cut core public health programs. And as members of Congress heard from the public about the importance of such agencies as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Health Resources and Services Administration as well as the Prevention and Public Health Fund in preserving and improving the health of the nation, lawmakers have worked to spare those programs from devastating budget cuts.

To help hold policy-makers accountable and to give advocates important tools for assessing the work of their elected officials, APHA published its annual Public Health Congressional Voting Record. And APHA's Public Health Fellowship in Government, for the

fourth consecutive year, placed a fellow in a key congressional office to help enhance public health science and knowledge in government.

APHA has been influential this year in further developing the linkages between transportation and health, releasing an online toolkit to help public health advocates spread the message to transportation decision-makers that the same options that improve public health also cut traffic congestion and keep roads safe and in good shape. The APHA webinar series "What Healthy Communities Need from their Transportation Networks" focused on such issues as preventing roadway deaths and injuries, the health benefits of active transportation and community health and transportation planning.

APHA's environmental advocacy included efforts to safeguard and strengthen the Clean Air Act and an ongoing push to illustrate the importance of understanding the link between climate change and health. APHA spoke out for the need to let the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency

move ahead with critically needed new rules to curb global warming pollution, joined with other health organizations in urging Congress to resist a move to weaken the Clean Air Act and publicly supported EPA's proposed rule designed to safeguard the public's health from dangerous air pollutants.

"Climate Change: Mastering the Public Health Role," released by APHA and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in April, is a practical guidebook to help public health practitioners address the serious health threats linked to climate change. The guidebook is a translation of a six-part webinar series hosted by APHA, CDC, the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials and the National Association of County and City Health Officials featuring climate change and health experts as well as federal and state leaders. APHA continues to promote environmental health leadership featuring oral histories of key professionals on its website and by working with CDC and partners to develop a National Environmental Health Partnership Council.



Also this year, APHA opened the Center for School, Health and Education. Seeded from a grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, the Center advances school-based health care as a comprehensive strategy for preventing school dropout and improving graduation rates. Through partnerships and policies, the Center is a catalyst for collaborative initiatives between the education and public health communities and will focus on the social determinants of educational success.



On the international health front, APHA strengthened ties with the Pan American Health Organization to work more collaboratively on global health issues of mutual interest. APHA also facilitated the development of two professional delegations to Cuba, led by former APHA President Carmen Nevarez, MD, MPH, that allowed members to study other health systems and share lessons learned and best practices.

The APHA 138th Annual Meeting and Exposition in Denver featured the latest public health science and was attended by more than 12,000 public health professionals. The diverse program featured nearly 1,000 scientific sessions and more than 700 exhibit booths. During the meeting, the Association adopted 17 policies addressing a broad range of public health concerns, from environmental health issues and public health education and workforce challenges to oral health prevention strategies and implications of immigration policy on public health outcomes. As an accredited provider of continuing education for physicians, nurses, certified health education specialists and those certified in public health, APHA granted nearly 16,000 hours of credit to attendees.

In a continued commitment to publication excellence, APHA published five new books this year, including titles on healthy homes, child care and megacities. Books published from 2010 and forward have been converted into an e-book format. Also, the newly released Mobile + Web version of the Control of Communicable Diseases Manual®, a public health standard first available in print in 1916 and now accessible via computers and mobile handheld devices, won an innovative apps contest award from Microsoft Windows.

*The Nation's Health* newspaper won awards both for news articles on abstinence-only pregnancy prevention programs and the rise of smokeless tobacco products as well as for overall excellence. Among the *American Journal of Public Health's* funded issue topics were mental health promotion and protection, sponsored by the CDC and Emory University; environmental approach to obesity prevention, funded by the California Endowment; and the role of school-based health care, funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation.



# Raising awareness, protecting public health

**A**PHA AGAIN SPEARHEADED NATIONAL Public Health Week®, the nation’s signature public health awareness-raising event, under the theme “Safety Is No Accident: Live Injury-Free.” This year’s observance featured a Twitter chat that virtually connected advocates nationwide and an Injury Prevention Road Tour with APHA leaders participating in NPHW events across the country. As part of the tour, former APHA President and CDC National Center for Injury Prevention Director Linda Degutis, DrPH, MSN, kicked off a Capitol Hill briefing with other injury prevention advocates. In addition, Sen. Tom Udall and Rep. Lucille Roybal-Allard introduced a congressional resolution recognizing the week.

Finding new ways to disseminate public health messages, APHA’s Get Ready® campaign this year expanded efforts to reach the general public. A novel handwashing initiative enabled APHA to deliver important hygiene tips to both APHA members and the public through the giveaway of handwashing timers. One target audience—mothers who blog—helped spread the handwashing message, and once again students at the high school, undergraduate and graduate level were awarded scholarships on the basis of their essays on preparedness.

Get Ready Day, timed annually in September to coincide with National Preparedness Month, featured the release of an animated video teaching the importance of preparing for emergencies and provided tools to individuals to help their communities be prepared.



Connecting people to trusted partners and tools is one of the hallmarks of the Association. With the advent of social media, APHA networks and communications outreach have skyrocketed. The total audience for APHA Twitter feeds, blogs and Facebook jumped to 135,000 over the course of the year. Time Magazine chose APHA as one of the top 140 Twitter feeds to follow.

APHA also launched Public Health Newswire at [www.publichealthnewswire.org](http://www.publichealthnewswire.org), an online aggregator of public health news. The new site provides a platform for covering daily headlines, reporting new research findings and spotlighting insights from public health leaders to keep public health professionals informed and connected.

### W.K. Kellogg Foundation

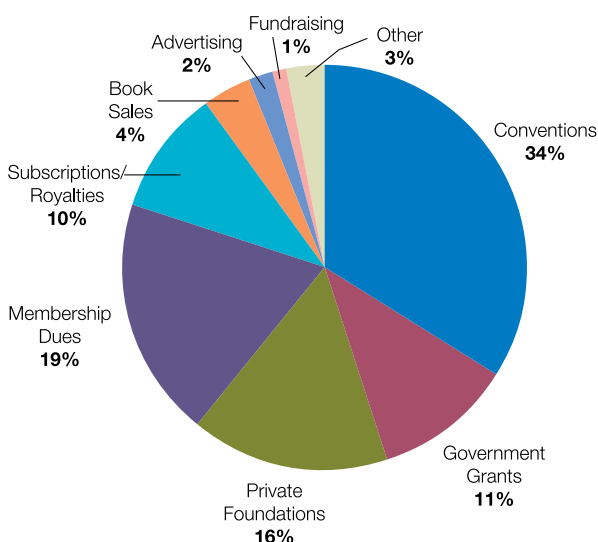

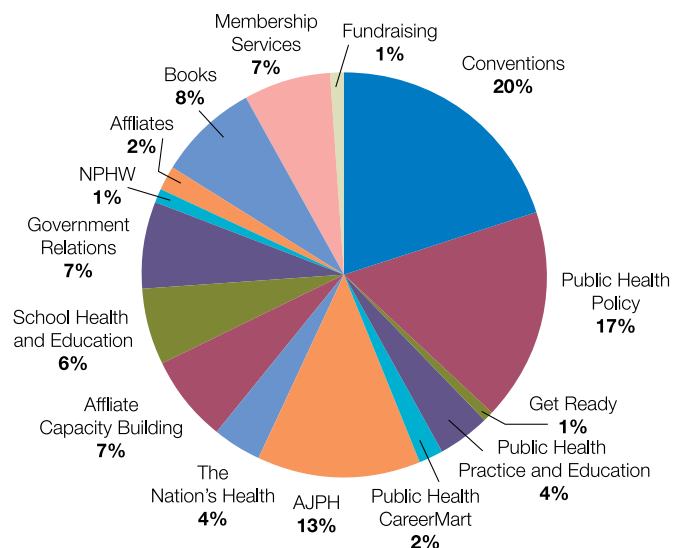
